We have had a really great start to the year. Our new Kindergarten students have settled in brilliantly and the older students are being welcoming and responsible. Learning has begun across the school with Australian History a theme across all classes for this term.

Homework

The most important way in which you can help your child can enhance their academic learning at home is by reading together and having rich discussion. Talking about their day and your day, about what they have learnt and what they have done (it helps to ask open ended questions like 'how?' and 'why?' rather than questions with a yes or no answer) is far more likely to improve their academic progress than worksheets. Of course, reading is just as important. A combination of you reading to them and them reading to you – plus lots of conversation about what you are reading – will make all the difference to their learning.

Our senior students will also bring home some formal homework as this helps develop their time management skills for high school. Please contact your child's teacher if you wish to give your child some extra help in a specific learning area.

Meet and Greet

All families are invited to join us at school on Tuesday 13 February at 5.30pm for an opportunity to informally meet with your child's teacher and other staff as well as get to know some of our new families. We hope that everyone can join us for a BBQ and a chance to welcome the new school year together.

P&C meeting

The first P&C meeting of the year will follow immediately after this social event from 6.30pm on Tuesday 13 February. We would love to have as many parents there as possible to be involved in planning for the year.

Personal Learning Plans

In 2018 we will once again organise meetings for each child, their family and their teacher to develop an individualised learning plan. If you are available during the school day, your half hour learning plan meeting will be scheduled during the day. Alternative times can be arranged as we would really like to meet with every family. Booking forms will begin going home this week with 1/2 having meetings on Monday 19 February.

Swimming Carnival

Our whole school swimming carnival will be held on Tuesday 20 February at the Goulburn Aquatic Centre. We will take all our confident swimmers for championship events but there will also be lots of activities for our younger students and non-swimmers. We hope to have as many parents there as possible. Music education is a very important part of early childhood education. Various studies have shown that music helps children learn more effectively. The GRC's aim is to provide high quality Early Childhood Music classes that are engaging, energetic and FUN!

Melodia is an interactive instrument-based program designed around the Early Years Learning Framework of play-based learning. Each week children are taken on a musical journey exploring the core concepts of music through musical games, singing, dancing, fun puppet friends, and a wide range of musical instruments that are cycled through weekly.

Fresh ways of teaching solfege, pitch, rhythm and dynamics techniques all revolve around live music and play which creates a fun and developmentally appropriate music program for the 0-7 year age group.

Competition - Conditions of Entry

- ♦ Roses are to be grown by the exhibitors, except for floral arrangements.
- ♦ Containers will be supplied, except for all floral arrangements, which must be completed prior to entry into the auditorium.
- ♦ Exhibitors to leave displays in place until the end of the show.
- ♦ Roses to be named wherever possible.
- ♦ Wiring is only permitted on exhibition roses.
- ♦ **Exhibition Roses:** Blooms are to be shown singly, the presence of a bud or buds will disqualify.
- ♦ **Stem:** Original new growth which carries a single bloom or bud.
- ♦ **Cut:** A cut is a stem that carries more than one bloom and/or bud or buds.
- ♦ **Distinct:** To be of a different cultivar.
- ♦ **NND - Not Necessarily Distinct,** i.e. they can be all of the same cultivar, all different cultivars or a combination of same and different cultivars.
- ♦ **Full Bloom Roses:** Blooms should clearly show stamens and be free of blemish.
- ♦ **Bud to Full Bloom:**
 - Stage 1:** Bud, to show colour, petals not starting to unfurl, and sepals to be disregarded.
 - Stage 2:** Bunch, midway between 1st and 3rd stage.
 - Stage 3:** Exhibition, as in an Exhibition Rose.
 - Stage 4:** Full Bloom, either full or open according to the cultivar.

10. 1 Vase of Miniature Roses, 3 stems and/or cuts, same cultivar, all stages preferred.
