Music education is a very important part of early childhood education. Various studies have shown that music helps children learn more effectively. The GRC's aim is to provide high quality Early Childhood Music classes that are engaging, energetic and FUN!

Melodia is an interactive instrument-based program designed around the Early Years Learning Framework of play-based learning. Each week children are taken on a musical journey exploring the core concepts of music through musical games, singing, dancing, fun puppet friends, and a wide range of musical instruments that are cycled through weekly.

Fresh ways of teaching solfege, pitch, rhythm and dynamics techniques all revolve around live music and play which creates a fun and developmentally appropriate music program for the 0-7 year age group.

SCHOOL ZONE PARKING OFFENCES		
	NO STOPPING Under no circumstances are you allowed to stop here. (Unless there is a medical or other emergency)	Maximum Penalty \$330 + 2 Demerit points
	NO PARKING You may stop here for no more than 2 minutes, when picking up or dropping off passengers and stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Otherwise no stopping is permitted.	Maximum Penalty \$183 + 2 Demerit points
	BUS ZONE You are not allowed to stop your vehicle unless you are driving a bus	Maximum Penalty \$330 + 2 Demerit points
	DOUBLE PARKING You are not permitted to stop or park your vehicle alongside another vehicle that is already parked parallel to the kerb.	Maximum Penalty \$330 + 2 Demerit points

SCHOOL ZONE TRAFFIC OFFENCES		
	CHILDREN CROSSING When flags are displayed, drivers must not proceed through the crossing if children or adults are still on the crossing or about to start crossing. This is the law regardless of the presence of a crossing supervisor. When children's crossings flags are not displayed, pedestrians should give way to passing road traffic.	Penalty \$549 + 4 Demerit points
	SPEEDING OFFENCES School Zone speeding offences attract higher fines & demerit points than other speeding offences.	Maximum Penalty \$2,530 + 7 Demerit points
	MOBILE PHONE USE Driving using a hand held phone in a school zone.	Penalty \$439 + 5 Demerit
