The teachers will be holding Personal Learning Goal (PLG) meetings at the beginning of next term for your children to create their next learning goals and the reports are an excellent place to start this process.

Also listed as part of the formal reporting process is each student's attendance. The NSW Department of Education expects that children attend school for 95% of the time or more. This equates to a total of 12 days absent a year. If your child has been absent for 6 days or less on the half yearly report they are on track to achieve the attendance expectation.

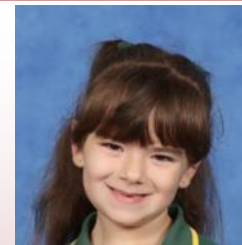
